Hi Raquel,

This is a follow up to our visit earlier today. I have been trying to contact the Office of Equity and Inclusion to find out if they have kept records of my Title IX complaints at PCC. I made an informal complaint at the downtown office, probably in late April, 2015. Two members of the Office of Equity and Inclusion took notes as I described sexual and other harassment I was experiencing in my classes from other students, and from teachers, and the large-scale surveillance that was happening through the PCC computer network (and via CCT visible & hidden cameras around campus).

Probably in early June 2015 I stopped by the office again, and was told the staff were all at a conference in Washington D.C. So I sat down and hand-wrote a 7 page letter describing more details of the harassment. I was told at the time there was no way to make a copy of that letter, so I left it in an envelope with the receptionist downstairs and she promised to give it to the right people when they returned from D.C.

The constant harassment began to wear on me so much it eventually drove me out of PCC, sadly without my being able to complete my Multimedia certificate. And then I continued to experience harassment at work.

Around September of last year I decided to make a formal Title IX complaint through the Department of Education (OCR Reference No. 10162219). I don't know if there were any records in your office related to that since it was ultimately denied as a jurisdiction issue: the officer (Samantha Wilson) claimed that I could not prove that the harassment was gender-based, thus not a Title IX issue.

My question to you is, is there an existing file at PCC relating to my complaints.

I am particularly interested in the letter I wrote in June of 2015, because it details a lot of my biggest complaints about the systemic nature of the harassment. If there is an existing file, I would like to find out how I can get a copy of it for my own records.

The problems I had were not isolated to PCC and I've since learned that others are experiencing similar patterns of group-harassment (possibly done for pay), and other similar things. I would like to document my history as completely as possible in order to confirm similar stories and hopefully help other victims find peace, accountability, & justice.
